## Annual Ten Year Trend

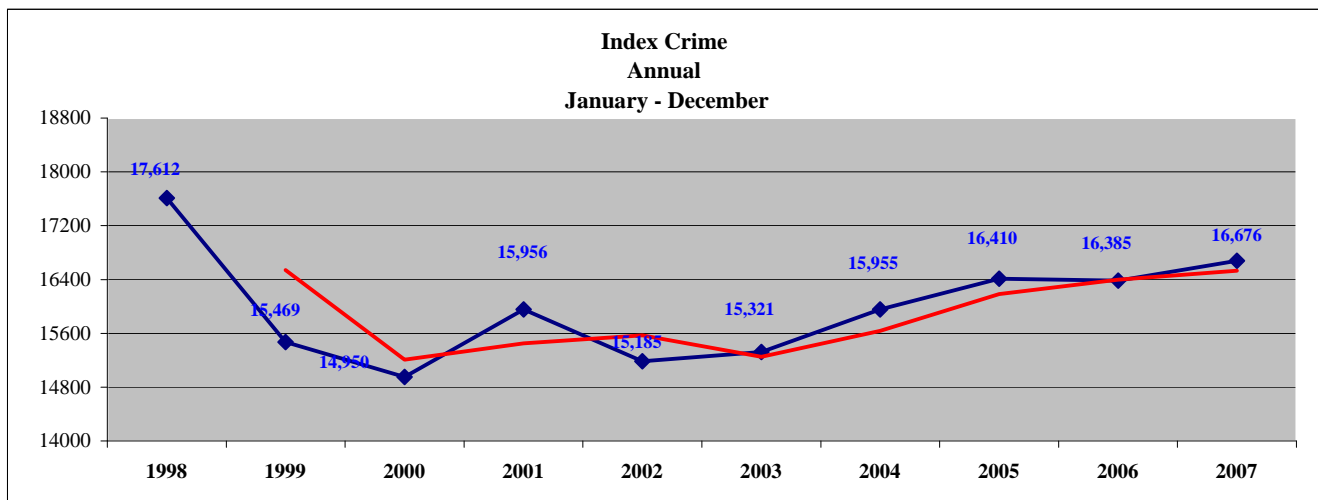
Index Crime is composed of selected offenses used to gauge fluctuations to the overall volume and rate of crime reported to law enforcement.

## Annual Ten Year Trend

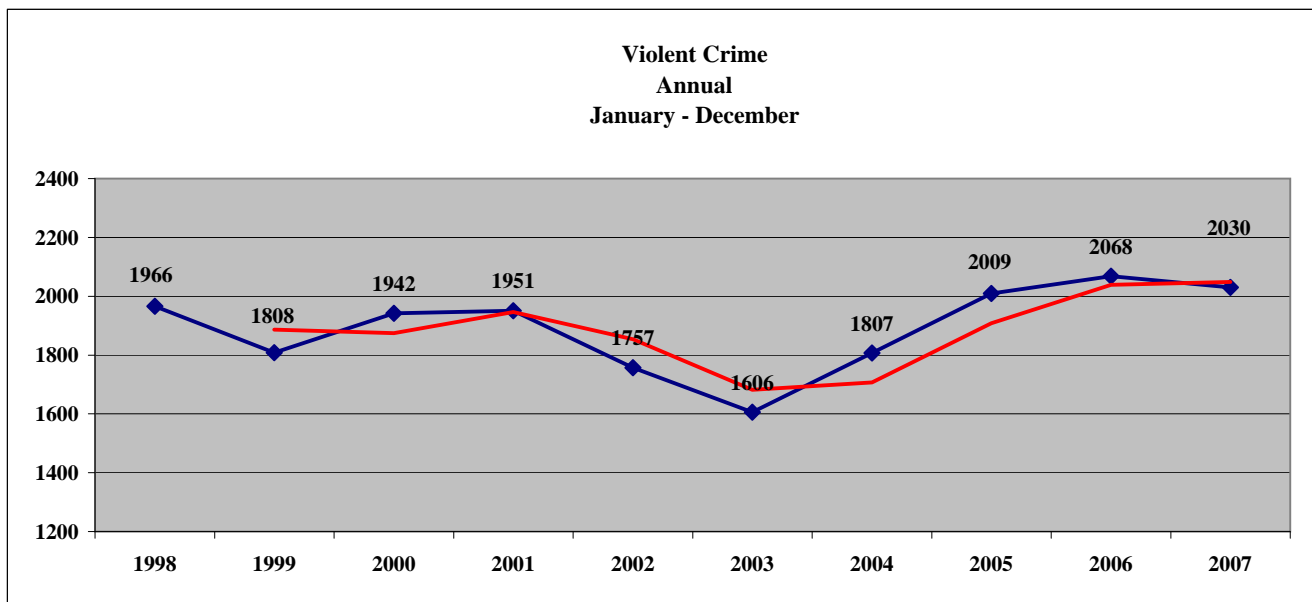
Violent Crime consist of the sum total of murders, rapes, robberies and aggravated assaults. All violent crimes involve force or the threat of force.

## Annual Ten Year Trend

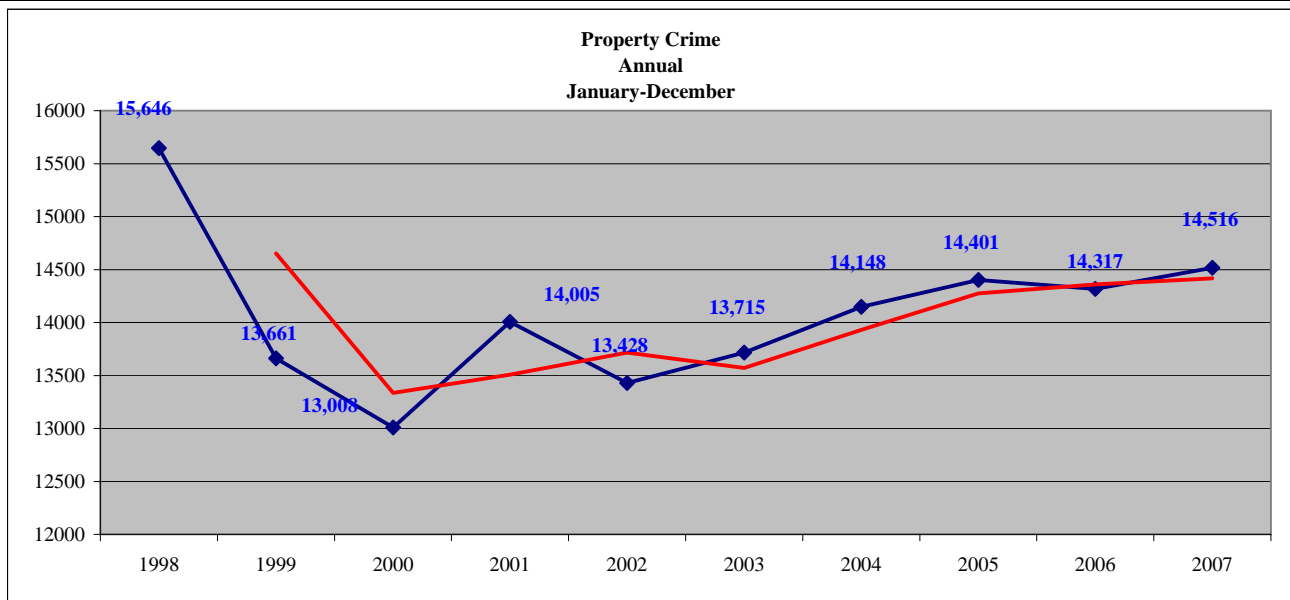
Property Crime includes the offenses of burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft. The object of these offenses is the taking of money or property but there is no force or threat of force against the victim.

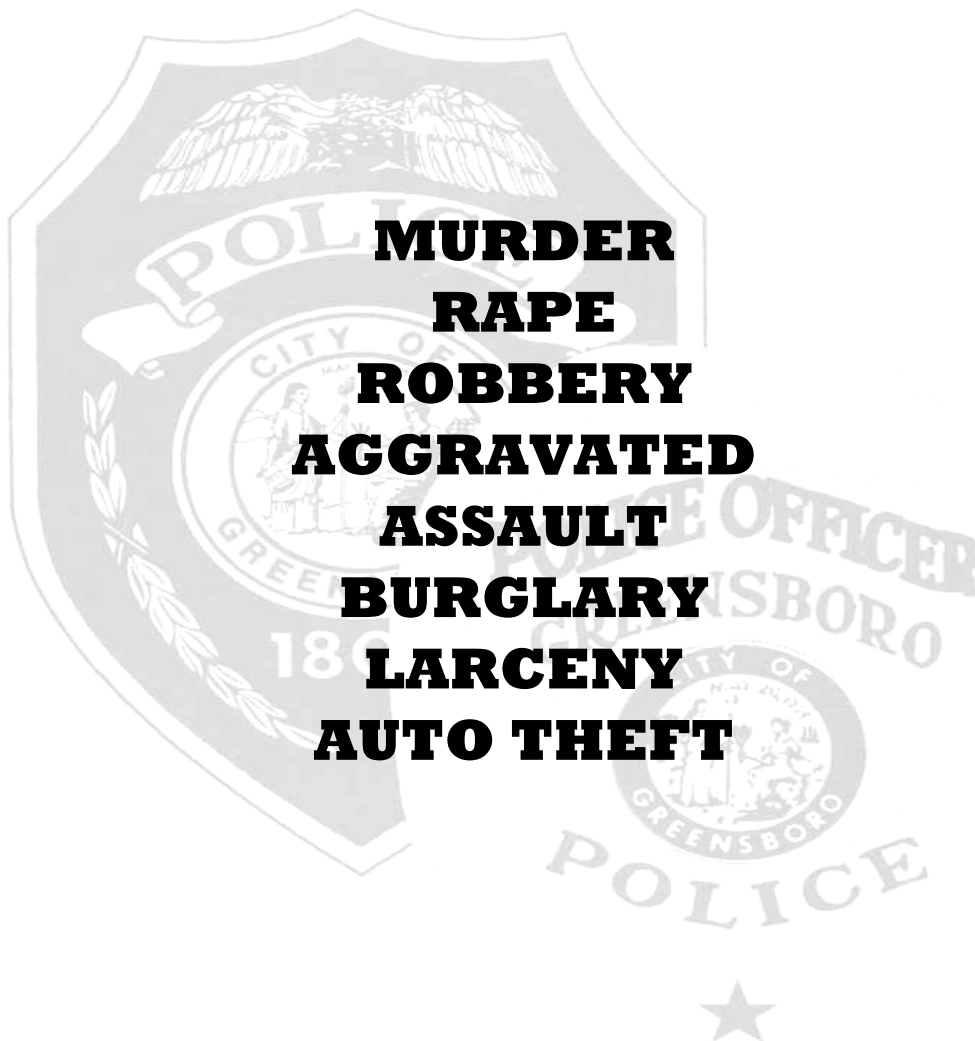

# Murder

## Annual Ten Year Trend

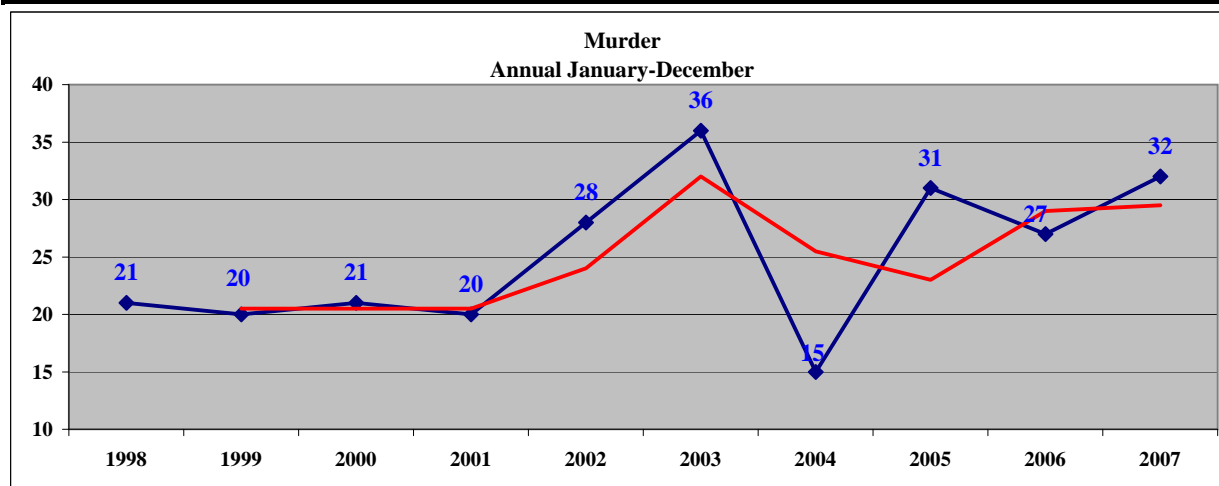
Murder, as defined in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program is the willful killing of one human being by another. The classification of this offense, as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury or other judicial body. Not included in the count for this offense classification are deaths caused by negligence, suicide or accident; justifiable homicides; and attempts to murder or assaults to murder, which are scored as aggravated assaults.
