Congratulations on Chief Bellamy's Selection to FBI National Executive Institute

The National Executive Institute Associates (NEIA) is a private, non-profit, public service foundation. Its membership consists of over 400 graduates of the FBI's National Executive Institute. The NEI is a three-week executive training program offered by the FBI to the chief executive officers of the largest law enforcement organizations in the United States, Canada, United Kingdom and Australia. The primary purpose of the NEI Associates is to assist in the continuing education and training of these executives. The National Executive Institute (NEI) was instituted by the FBI in 1976 and it quickly became recognized as one of the great law enforcement training programs in the world.

Chief Tim Bellamy has been selected to participate in the National Executive Institute Program Management Session XXXII. He is only the second Chief of Police from the State of North Carolina to be appointed to this esteemed program. During the three cycles, Chief Bellamy will have the opportunity to travel to Fredericksburg, Virginia; Sydney, Australia; and Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. The expenses and fees are paid exclusively by NEIA.

The NEIA was formed in 1980. Its original and current objective is to provide continuing training and education to the graduates of the NEI. This program has also been quite successful. At the present time, the Associates have a close working relationship with the Major City Chiefs and the FBI Academy. The NEIA presents the annual Penrith Award to a member for excellence in law enforcement administration. In addition, the Associates give a graduate studies scholarship to a child of an NEIA member annually.
