DESCRIPTION:

Tying Flies, February 5, 6:30 – 9:30 pm

Ages 10 & older, \$35

Class teaches students to tie 4-6 patterns; dries, nymphs and terrestrials, as well as emphasize the fly tying materials, techniques and characteristics that make a great small stream trout fly.

Birds of Winter, February 9, 10 – 11 am

All ages, Free!

Find out what kinds of birds are still hanging around for the colder months in North Carolina. Learn what birds to look for and where to find them as well as how they adapt to survive the harsher seasons.

Carolina Yards, February 14, 6:30 – 7:30 pm

Ages 10 & older, Free!

Learn how to design, install, and maintain a Carolina yard that works with the environment rather than against it. Play a landscape game and learn design principles, proper site and plant selection, soils/bed preparation and pest control.

Tying Bead Heads, February 19, 6:30 – 9:30 pm

Ages 10 & older, \$40

Learn some great new patterns using one of fly tying's staple items, brass, glass, and tungsten beads. Students will learn to tie 4-6 patterns not offered before.

Intermediate Fly Tying, February 23, 8 am – 2 pm
