| <p>Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF): The CWSRF assists in the funding of wastewater treatment facilities and projects associated with estuary and nonpoint source programs. Eligible uses for the funds include construction of publicly-owned wastewater treatment facilities, local sewers, sewer interceptors, water recycling facilities, and expanded use projects such as implementation of nonpoint source (NPS) projects or programs and stormwater treatment.</p> | Incinerator - upgrade and install redundant system | \$27,400,000 | Council Direction | Council consideration of application April 7. | <p>Diesel Emission Reduction Act Grants: The National Diesel Emissions Reduction Program will receive funding under this legislation to supplement the existing funding. This funding will support clean diesel grant and loan programs administered by states. | <p>Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Grants used to hire and train community policing professionals, acquire and deploy cutting-edge crime-fighting technologies, and develop and test innovative policing strategies. COPS Office funding provides training and technical assistance to advance community policing at all levels of law enforcement, from line officers to law enforcement executives, as well as others in the criminal justice field.
