

# *Resistance Move To Continue*

WINSTON-SALEM, Feb. 11 (AP)—

An estimated 500 Negroes pledged themselves here today to continue their "passive resistance" movement against segregated lunch counters in certain downtown stores until the counters are completely integrated.

Negro college students and high school students attended a meeting on the campus at Winston-Salem Teachers College.

Hitherto disorganized, they organized today and named Carl Matthews, the man who started the resistance movement here as their executive chairman.
