

STATE NAACP UNIT ENDORSES PROTESTS

CHARLOTTE, Feb. 11 (AP)—The North Carolina chapter of the NAACP issued a statement Thursday endorsing the "orderly protests" at lunch counters in six cities against segregated service.

Kelly Alexander, state NAACP president, put out this statement:

"The North Carolina State Conference, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, endorses unequivocally the orderly protests being made by college and high school students throughout the state in their efforts to secure the right to use on an equal basis all facilities in places of public accommodation that solicit the patronage of the total population.

"In our opinion they have the moral and human right to be treated equally in a democratic society."
