

Two Groups Back Negro Protests

CHARLOTTE, Feb. 13 (AP)—Two organizations came out here today supporting a wave of sit-down protests by Negroes seeking service at lunch counters.

One statement was issued by the Rev. Sidney Freeman of Charlotte, president of the North Carolina chapter of the Unitarian Fellowship for Social Justice. The other was issued in the name of the officers of the North Carolina Council on Human Relations and signed by Harry S. Jones, executive secretary of the group and one of the Negro student leaders in the Charlotte protests.
