Being a frequent visitor to Greensboro, I cannot understand the Negroes permitting such deplorable incidents such as the harassment by invasion of stores, knowing what the white people have done for them, such as schools largely financed by whites.

Lincoln, who certainly had no malice and who is the patron saint of the dark people, said in Illinois in 1858 that "the races should be forbidden to mix" and when a delegation called after the Emancipation Proclamation as to what was for them, he said, "Remember you are a different people and have brought great sorrow on the nation"—thinking no doubt of the thousands who were left dead on the battlefields.

It would seem that first-class citizens would have more pride than to barge in where they might not be wanted. White folks have clubs that do not invite many whites. The Negro weakens his stand by such intrusion and shows hate.
