

# Boycott Of Stores Urged

RALEIGH, March 12 (UPI)—Baptist student leaders at State College called for a boycott today of Raleigh business establishments where sitdown protests against segregated lunch counters are being staged by Negroes.

The action was announced in a resolution by the Baptist Student Union Executive Council which represents 400-500 of the college's 6,000 students.

The resolution urged that the boycott remain in force "until such unequal policies are terminated."

Support was offered for "the moral goal of Negroes for social equality under the law of our land and to uphold the right of Negro students and leaders to use the instrument of active but non-violent public demonstration to advance their cause."

Negroes in Winston-Salem, one of several Tar Heel cities hit by the sitdown protests, pledged to stage such a boycott more than a week ago.

The action at State College came less than a week after Gov. Luther H. Hodges asked heads of state-supported colleges to use their influence to bring an end to the sitdown demonstrations. The college is a state-supported institution.
