

# 2 Negroes In Protest Convicted

*[White men convicted, B1.]*

RALEIGH, March 14 (UPI)—

Two Negro college students, arrested last month during a sit-down protest against segregated eating facilities, were convicted today of trespassing on privately-owned sidewalks of a shopping center.

City Court Judge Albert Doub fined Thomas Alexander Hairston and George Samuel, both Shaw University students \$10 and cost of court each.

Seven defense attorneys, including Jack Greenberg of New York City who is a counsel for the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, conferred for several minutes aft-

er Doub's ruling and then gave notice of appeal. The two teenagers were freed under \$25 bond each.

The Negroes were arrested at Cameron Village Shopping Center Feb. 13, one day after 41 Negroes were jailed on similar charges stemming from sit-down protests. Attorneys said they wanted time to talk with the other defendants and would probably have the cases stipulated on the outcome of Monday's trial. Doub set March 28 for a decision from the defense counsel.
