

White Citizens Urge Integrated Counter Service

Sixty-eight white citizens of Greensboro have sent an open letter to the mayor's advisory committee on community relations, other local groups and the Woolworth and Kress firms urging lunch counter service in the two stores be on a "first come, first served basis."

The letter states that "We, the undersigned, citizens of Greensboro and patrons of the stores of F. W. Woolworth Co. and S. H. Kress Co., urge that service to all customers at the lunch counters in these stores be entirely on a 'first come, first served' basis, just as it is in other areas of these establishments.

"We feel that the majority of people in Greensboro believe in the brotherhood of all men, and will support this democratic stand."

Copies also were sent to the Greensboro Ministerial Fellowship members, the chaplain at A&T College and the local, regional and national offices of the Woolworth and Kress chains.
