

# Drug Firm Scene Of Negro Protest

WINSTON-SALEM, March 26 (AP)—Negro pickets paraded in front of Walgreen Drug Co. here today in protest against the store's segregated eating facilities.

Pickets, some of them from Winston-Salem Teachers College, worked in shifts of three.

They said the picketing would continue daily until the store desegregates its counters.

The store reopened its counters earlier this week after remaining closed for several days. Other lunch counters where protests have been staged are still closed.

A Walgreen employe stood in the aisle leading to the store's eating area. None of the protesters attempted to enter the area.

The protesters limited their pickets to three because of a warning after a mass march to city hall earlier this month. Protesters then were warned that such a demonstration constituted a parade requiring a permit.

The protesters checked today with the police department and got permission to picket. Their spokesman said they were told that no more than five persons would be allowed to picket and that they must keep moving.
