

Expelled Negro Ministry Student Enrolls In Boston

BOSTON, June 7 (AP)—Rev. James M. Lawson, 31, Negro minister expelled from Vanderbilt University for participating in antisegregation lunch counter demonstrations, settled down to classroom activity at Boston University today—intent on earning his degree by summer's end.

Lawson is enrolled for two summer courses to complete the 12 credit hours needed to qualify him for a bachelor of sacred theology degree.

Lawson, a Methodist, was expelled last March. Divinity School Dean J. Robert Nelson and nine Vanderbilt faculty members resigned in protest against the Nashville school's refusal to readmit him to a summer session.
