

NAACP Delegates Picket Two Stores

ST. PAUL, Minn., June 24 (AP)—Delegates to the annual convention of the National Assn. for Advancement of Colored People planned mass picketing at two St. Paul chain stores today to protest the companies' segregation policies in the South.

News yesterday that 45 lunch counters in previously segregated northern Virginia will begin serving Negro and white customers together set off a prolonged, emotional demonstration at a workshop session of youth delegates to the convention. Many are veterans of sit-ins.

Roy Wilkins, NAACP executive secretary, told the group their actions in sit-in demonstrations across the South "have given new life and pertinency" to the NAACP's civil rights program.
