

Grand Jury Returns 101 True Bills

Four Indicted For Murder

Guilford's Grand Jury yesterday returned 101 true bills of indictment, including four against persons charged with murder, one with first degree burglary, one with rape, one with making and selling poisonous liquor, and 45 Negro and white students charged with trespass.

The students were indicted in connection with sit-in demonstrations seeking integration of lunch counters at local stores.

Indicted on murder charges were David Jennings Kitzmiller, 24, of 2523 Spring Garden St., Charles Henry Carr, 23, of 303 Regan St., Charles Wesley Milton, 22, of Route 2, Brown Summit, and Clara Belle Swaim, 29, of High Point.

Pistol-Knife-Rifle

Kitzmiller is charged with murdering his stepfather, F. R. Coltrane, on June 21 with a 22-caliber pistol. Carr is charged with the fatal knifing June 18 of James Paul Rowe. Milton allegedly killed Florence Doggett Milton with a 12-gauge shotgun July 2. The High Point woman is charged with the fatal shooting of George Harper Welborn on June 5 with a 22-caliber rifle.

Robert Lee Jones, 45-year-old Negro of 829 E. Market St., is charged with first degree burglary. He allegedly broke into a home at 518 Thomas St. while occupants were sleeping.

A 35-year-old High Point man, Robert William Brown of the Clara Cox Apartments, is charged with a raping a 16-year-old girl June 12.

Liquor Indictment

Camellia Graham of Brown Summit was indicted on a charge of manufacturing and selling liquor which contained lead salts.

A Greensboro man, Jim Black, 46, of 44½ Fieldcrest St., is charged with assaulting a 10-year-old girl with intent to rape her.

One of the persons indicted yesterday was charged with manslaughter. William Sanders, 33, of 803 S. Ashe St. was indicted in the death April 20 of Jesse Williams.

Also charged with manslaughter was Walter Daniel Jackson, 23, of Burlington. He was indicted in the death of Shirley Williams on Highway 220 six miles south of Greensboro last April 21.

Two 18-year-old residents of Route 4, High Point, Bobby Ray Beeson and Benny Raeford Chaney, were indicted on perjury charges.

Assault Indictments

Two High Point men were indicted on assault with deadly weapons with intent to kill charges. Marvin Garrett, 21, was charged with stabbing Martin Lee, and Ben McGraw, 30, was charged with stabbing Clifton Joseph.

Three counts each of larceny and receiving are held against Gilbert Stephenson Fisher, 19, of Kannapolis and Concord and Robert Smith, 19, of Charlotte and Rockingham.

The grand jury returned a not true bill against Thomas Howard Payne, 36, who had been charged with larceny of an auto. He lives on Percy Street.

The case of Bernard Osborne Allred, 24, of 1826 Perkins St., charged with larceny from a person, was continued.
