

Library Sitdown Brings Arrests

GREENVILLE, S.C., July 13 (AP)—Two Negro sitdown protests were staged in the Greenville Public Library today. Eight Negroes were arrested and charged with disorderly conduct as a result of the second demonstration.

There was no disturbance during either protest. Seven Negroes entered the library during the morning, but left quietly when two policemen were called.

The second group of eight Negroes, several of whom had been in the morning demonstration, entered the library during the early afternoon. They were arrested and booked.

During the morning demonstration, four women and three men entered the library, took seats and requested books.

Librarian Charles E. Stow asked the group to leave. He suggested that they go to the branch unit for Negroes.

However, the Negroes remained seated until the policemen were summoned. They then left quietly.

It was the third such demonstration this year. Arrests were made previously.
