

Eleven Negroes Refused Service At Charleston, S.C.

CHARLESTON, S.C., July 26

(AP)—Eleven Negro youths sat unserved at the lunch counter of the W. T. Grant variety store here Monday for three and a half hours.

The store suspended service and roped off the area shortly after the Negroes arrived about noon.

A city policeman and a detective stood by until the Negroes left the store at about 3:30 p.m.

It was the second demonstration at Grants this month. Another sit-in at the Kress store was blocked Monday when the lunch counter was roped off before a group of about 30 Negroes could seat themselves.
