

Two Negroes Attacked In Store

SPARTANBURG, S.C., July 27
(P) — White spectators attacked demonstrators at two variety stores here today when Negroes protested segregated lunch counter service.

In Greenville, 30 miles west of here, at 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. curfew on persons under 21 restored a fitful peace after two nights of racial gang fighting.

Spartanburg police booked two white men and two Negroes for investigation after punches were thrown at the Woolworth variety store lunch counter. Officers arrested a white man for disorderly conduct after a white man was slugged as he left the Kress

variety store with Negro demonstrators.

The first demonstrators, George Cleveland Foster, 17, and Willie Nathan Campbell, 20, appeared at the Woolworth lunch counter and took seats.

Conversation

Witnesses said two white men watching the Negroes had this conversation:

"What do you reckon it would cost if I shoved somebody off a stool?"

"About 50 to a hundred dollars."

"Well, it oughta be worth that."

One of the pair walked to the counter and struck one of the Negroes, then grabbed him by the shoulders. The other white man slugged the second Negro behind the ear.

Detectives, who had been forewarned about the demonstration, arrested the white men and Foster and Campbell.

At police station, Chief Ralph Prince identified the white men as Olin D. Emory, 20, and Earl K. Jackson, 33, both of Spartanburg.
