

Two Negroes Served Lunch At Dairy Bar

The Guilford Dairy Bar in the Summit Shopping Center yesterday served lunch to two Negroes but the dairy president Mose Kiser declined to say last night whether integrated service would follow at the company's other retail outlets.

The dairy, which has heretofore refused to serve Negroes at its counters, thus became the third business in the city to break the color line in as many days.

The S.H. Kress and F.W. Woolworth stores in the downtown area integrated their lunch counters Monday.

The dairy bar served a Negro couple who entered the store shortly before noon yesterday, ate lunch, and left.

Integration, at least of the variety stores, came as a result of a meeting several weeks ago between Woolworth manager Clarence L. Harris, members of the Greensboro Citizens Association, a Negro group, and members of the Mayor's Advisory Committee on Community Relations.

The mayor's committee, which failed to bring about integration here last spring, has said it is now acting only in an advisory capacity.
