

SUBJECT: 9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance: City Costs

At the August 16, 2011 City Council Meeting, Council approved the issuance of \$15,000 in cash or in-kind services to the Volunteer Center in support of the 9/11 Day of Service and Remembrance event.

Based on the estimated cost and expense to the City in support of this event, I suggest we provide \$10,000 of in-kind services and \$5,000 in cash.

The Coliseum will discount the use of the Amphitheatre rental fees valued at \$5,000. We cannot off-set an additional \$10,000 in cost for rental of the Amphitheatre, as the cost is for event staffing, stagehands, stage cover rental, and other similar fees which are third-party expenses.

The Greensboro Police Department (GPD) and Fire Departments (GFD) are loaning equipment displays and labor on-site for Community Outreach at the event, which is valued at \$4,000 (\$2000 per department). In addition, the GPD can absorb approximately \$1,000 in Police labor towards the associated traffic management.

We will also support the event through media and community outreach efforts, using the City's web-site and e-mail distribution lists, which reaches roughly 35,000 people.

SUBJECT: Feedback from the Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS)
Site Visit

On August 25, 2011, a representative from the Department of Justice's Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) visited Greensboro to assess the Police Department's compliance with a \$4,600,230 grant that was awarded in 2010 to pay for 30 additional officers.

Mr. Alex Edwards met with more than 20 law enforcement, City and community representatives to learn first-hand about our community policing strategies. In a very collaborative dialogue, leaders discussed our community policing efforts including public safety priorities and the Strategic Coordination of Resources (SCORE) initiative. Community members and police representatives further shared crime prevention efforts such as National Night Out, "Get Locked", and Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED). The group also discussed problem-solving initiatives such as the Center City Resource Team Graffiti Reduction Operation, the High Point Road/Lee Street Corridor Strategic Plan, and the Citizens Advisory Council.

In addition to reviewing our community policing activities, Mr. Edwards was here to ensure compliance with the provisions of the grant, and offer technical assistance. He spoke favorably of our financial review and program implementation. Mr. Edwards will provide formal results in a report from the COPS office within a month.

SUBJECT: Assistance to Firefighters Grant Application Submission: Fitness Equipment

The Greensboro Fire Department plans to submit a grant application for fitness equipment for fire stations to the US Fire Administration of the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The grant application deadline is September 7, 2011. The Fire Department will request that City Council consider approving the application at their next Council meeting on September 13, 2011.

The Assistance to Firefighters Grant funds the purchase of one piece of cardiovascular exercise equipment in twelve (12) Fire Stations. The Greensboro Fire Department is committed to the health and fitness of its personnel in order to provide optimal performance for our citizens on emergency scenes, as well as to reduce injuries and the costs associated with workers' compensation.

If approved by Council and awarded by FEMA, this grant will enable the Fire Department to help reduce workers' compensation costs, as the City Medical Director recommends members of the GFD increase their cardiovascular health and reduce their body weight. According to the City Medical Director, firefighters are far less likely to be sick, injured, or permanently disabled on the job if they maintain an optimal fitness level.

The Grant requires a 20% match. The application is planned for a total amount currently estimated at \$30,000.00, with \$22,000.00 from FEMA funds and the local match of \$6,000.00 included in the total. The Fire Department has budgeted funds towards the purchase and maintenance of fitness equipment. These funds would be utilized towards the matching funds should the grant be awarded. Additional details will be provided to Councilmembers in the agenda packet for the September 13, 2011, City Council meeting.
