• Community Gardens Update

White Street Landfill Gas Utilization Project

The City has posted a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for potential bidders for the White Street Landfill Gas Utilization Project on the City's website at the following address: https://eserv.greensboro-nc.gov/procurement/SourcingSupplier/controller.servlet?service=list&webappName=SourcingSupplier&name=OpenForBid&bto=com.lawson.apps.ss.SourcingEvent_Manager&_susec=true&procurement&_frommenu=true.

The RFQ invites potential bidders to develop and complete plans to beneficially use methane gas generated by the landfill. The City's Waste Management & Recycling Task Force recommended the use of an RFQ to discover and determine potential ways that the landfill's methane can safely become a source of positive net revenue for Greensboro, without adversely impacting the surrounding neighborhood.

A voluntary site meeting for potential bidders will be held on January 23, 2013 at 10 am at the White Street Landfill. The question and answer period will end January 29, 2013 and bidders have until February 19, 2013 to respond. A selection committee will review proposals to select a short list of developers to continue in the process.

SUBJECT: Community Gardens Update

City Council requested staff to direct the Sustainability Council to recommend a process to guide citizens in the development of community gardens. At the November 19, 2012, Community Sustainability Council (CSC) meeting, the CSC devised a preliminary recommended process to guide citizens in the development of community gardens. They seek to have a final proposed process through its *Nature in the City* sub-committee led by Carolyn Allen in early 2013. Mrs. Allen is working with Karen Neill of the Guilford County Agricultural Extension Service and Brooks Mullane of Greensboro's Parks and Recreation Department.

The preliminary recommendations from the November 19, 2012 meeting are as follows:

- Work with the City to identify 1-2 city-owned parcels in which a community garden can be created
- Request City Council to consider changing a city ordinance to allow storage sheds to be on properties that do not have a main building
- Request City to establish a water meter on city parcel where community garden would be (estimated cost: \$1000)
- Interested parties in creating a community garden could approach the Community Foundation's Buildings for Strong Neighborhoods for a grant with the City and the CSC serving as partners
- Interested parties should also reach out to the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service who assists with the planning and planting of community gardens
- Interested parties should apply for City's Small Neighborhood Project Grant through Park & Rec for leverage funding purposes

The *Nature in the City* subcommittee is evaluating regulatory barriers to community gardens, problems with sustaining community efforts, etc.

SUBJECT: City Contracts

At the December 18, 2012, City Council meeting, Councilmember Bellamy-Small requested information on the comparison on contracts awarded to contractors within the City of Greensboro versus those external of the city limits. Between January 1, 2012 and December 31, 2012, the City awarded 121 construction contracts and construction project related professional services contracts. Below is the breakdown between vendors with office locations within the City of Greensboro and other locations.

SUBJECT: Stormwater Residential Billing Update

Summary

The Stormwater Management Division recently completed a review of stormwater utility accounts following an impervious area update as a result of new aerial photography. The latest aerial photography was provided by the City's Information Technology Department and allowed the Stormwater Management Division to update its billing records to ensure that fees are being accurately assessed. In the City of Greensboro, every commercial and residential property is charged a stormwater fee and bills are based on the amount of impervious area found on a property (an average of 2543 square feet for a typical residential property). The billing rates are divided into three residential tiers and calculated using the latest aerial photography and/or property records. Using the data provided, it was determined that 10,216 residential accounts need billing adjustments. Of the 10,216 accounts affected, 7,316 accounts are currently under billed and 2,900 accounts are overbilled. Each of the 10,216 accounts affected have been individually reviewed to ensure billing accuracy. In most cases, the billing adjustment will amount to \$1.20 per month or \$14.40 a year.

It should be noted that the billing rate has not changed since 2004 and it is not increasing now. The primary goal of this evaluation is to ensure the accuracy of resident's stormwater utility accounts. The accounts will be updated over the next three months, and notification will be provided to all residents affected by the change.

We received a total of 4 comments this week:

Field Operations - 4 comments:

- Customer is very upset that the leaf truck is in the neighborhood today. She said we always get her leaves first and it does not give her time to get the leaves out. Caller wants us to leave her leaves for last next time.
- Customer wants us to know that not everyone uses the internet. So it is not easy to get the calendars printed.
- Since being changed to every other week in 2008, my need for recycling pick up has actually grown. The number of items I have to be recycled has increased due to a number of factors that are affecting residents of Greensboro citywide. More companies are packaging their products in recyclable materials, my awareness of what can be recycled (and the importance of doing so!) has also been increased, and most recently, the City has wonderfully added more items to the list of recyclables. My weekly need for recycling pick up is actually greater than my need for trash pickup. I can't imagine that I'm alone in this. The City should make trash pickup every other week, and return recycling pickup to a weekly service. My 9 year old son agrees!
- Elderly caller passing along a good comment about yard waste crew. She wasn't quite finished putting out her yard waste yesterday. The crew on Halifax Rd helped her finish. They were so patient, courteous, and helpful and she is very thankful. The crew is always professional and they never complain. They always clean up whatever she puts out, but yesterday they went out of their way to help out.
