Subject: National Alliance for Non-Violent Programming

The Internal Audit Division has performed a program and compliance audit of the National Alliance for Non-Violent Programming, which received a Human Services Grant in the amount of \$13,000 from the City of Greensboro during the 2001-2002 grant year. This grant was reduced to \$9,750 due to the City's budget constraints.

The NANP grant helped support the administrative and operational expenses incurred with providing workshops for low-income youth from the Claremont Court Boys & Girls Club. These workshops focus on deterrence of viewing violent programming; stereotyping; prejudice and racism. Approximately 30 clients were served during the grant year.

We examined selected financial transactions and program documentation maintained by the agency for compliance with the contract and for assurance that program goals were achieved. Based on our review, it appears that the funds have been spent according to the terms of the contract with no exceptions noted.
