By now we have all seen or heard about the horrific killing of George Floyd by a Minneapolis police officer. These incidents have sparked a myriad of emotions and highlighted disparities in law enforcement treatment of black people across the country. In light of this situation, the Greensboro Criminal Justice Advisory Commission (GCJAC) wants to take this opportunity to say that we stand in solidarity with those seeking to enhance transparency and accountability among our police departments. The mission of the GCJAC is to monitor, review, analyze, educate and report on various issues within the criminal justice continuum to help increase transparency and accountability within the Greensboro Police Department. The GCJAC looks at the policies and procedures of the police department and makes recommendations for changes. The commission also looks at data to identify trends in police interactions with the public. In addition to identifying larger systematic issues, the GCJAC also houses the Police Community Review Board (PCRB) a subcommittee of the GCJAC that is tasked with reviewing individual complaints to determine if GPD acted within their policy. During these turbulent times the GCJAC is here to support the Greensboro community and create space for dialog and solution driven conversations.
