Dear City Council --

I'm not here to ask for the Greensboro Police Department (GPD) to be defunded, but I am here to ask that we have some real reflection on the events that transpired in Greensboro over the past few days, and a reassessment of what the role of the GPD is.

I will say I am highly disappointed and shamed by the actions of the GPD I've witnessed over the past few days, especially given Greensboro's place in the civil rights history books. I was expecting so much more from Greensboro -- listening, understanding, empathy, civility, thoughtfulness, caring, solidarity. What I saw was strongarm tactics and escalation that only served to heighten tensions and emotions.

Unlike neighboring cities such as Winston-Salem and Durham, the GPD took a militarized approach to the protests, and built an early sense of "us vs. them." It made my heart sink to see police in riot gear walking the streets on Friday night standing in tactical lines instead of mingling with and joining the crowds like I read about in Durham and WS.

If the police want to be respected by the community, they cannot stand apart from the community, especially when it is ailing. There needs to be an understanding and thought given to how our local government and our local police force that is sworn to "protect and serve" can help slowly open the pressure release valve instead of tamping it down and causing it to explode.

While I wasn't on the streets around midnight on Friday on S Elm, I watched live from numerous Facebook streams, and I saw with my own eyes how armored, intimidating lines of GPD shot rounds of tear gas into a peaceful crowd who were just standing in the streets expressing their frustrations. There was no warning, there was no one on a loudspeaker, there were no police in the area talking to the crowds earlier -- and all of a sudden there were tear gas canisters launched into the air at the crowd.

I'm not saying there were no acts of vandalism before that as there were a few windows busted before that exchange, but from every stream I was watching -- about a half-dozen -- 99.9% of the crowd was doing absolutely nothing except standing in the street, holding signs, and expressing their frustration at current events. 20 seconds after the tear gas hit the ground, people were running and you heard window after window after window break. Poking the hornet's nest is a horrible tactic when you're trying to gain trust, and GPD absolutely blew it in that moment. There was no community, there was no understanding, there was no pressure release, only adversarial disdain.

We should not be surprised when the time bomb that's been ticking for 244 years finally explodes, but we can control our own actions and not throw gasoline on the ensuing fire. What I saw this weekend was GPD throwing gas, and it literally made me cry to see that happen in a city that has such an historical, powerful past, and what I hope is a strong future.

Hopefully we can make some tangible changes and do better in the future, but that's not going to happen without wilful, direct, and often difficult choices on your part.
