



Greensboro Street Resurfacing FACT SHEET



The City of Greensboro maintains more than 1,040 miles of streets. Streets vary from two-lane local streets to six-lane arterials (major streets).

Each street is evaluated every 2-3 years and assigned a pavement condition rating between 0 (very poor) and 100 (excellent). The average rating for Greensboro's streets is 62.

Typically, streets in the worst condition are given higher priority for resurfacing. Factors such as traffic volume, safety, new development, and utility construction can affect priority.



It costs approximately \$190,000 per mile to resurface a two-lane road. This cost includes adjusting manholes, grinding existing pavement, installing sidewalk access ramps, placing new asphalt and marking pavement.

The City's annual resurfacing budget for 2020 is \$6,400,000.

Greensboro's resurfacing program is funded through a combination of sources, including the State Street-Aid "Powell Bill" Program, Motor Vehicle Registration Fees, and General Obligation Bonds approved by voters.
